As of 2017, nearly 30,000 student-athletes and more than 10,000 NICA coaches have reflected these core values through their participation in league races, leaders' summits and student-athlete advocacy programs such as NICA's Teen Trail Corps. Twenty-two League Directors and their management teams remain committed to NICA's core values through their tireless efforts in recruitment, retention, training, race production and their continuous drive to seek excellence in their programs. Because of the unwavering dedication to our core values -- from those in the NICA community and our many supporters -- we continue to have year-over-year participation increases of nearly 40%. Overall, through NICA's work, hundreds of thousands of people have been connected with interscholastic mountain biking as student-athletes, team mechanics, team managers, coaches, volunteers, sponsors, donors, family members and spectators! 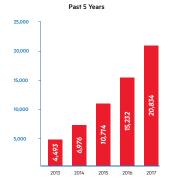
